These networks seek to increase the number of children developmentally “on track”, ensuring a positive start and ongoing success at school. Continue to engage Early Years Coaches who will work with schools and early childhood centres to support the Early Years Neighbourhood Networks to implement actions plans focused on increasing the number of children “on track” when starting school. This could include actions to: increase Kindergarten attendance; develop oral language skills; improve children’s social skills to help them relate to others; or develop their emotional maturity so they can make friends easily and become more resilient. Increase utilisation of Early Intervention Clinicians for Eagleby and Yarrabilba by working with cross-sector partnerships 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Support training and mentoring for teachers so they can confidently develop childrens emotional maturity and social skills to help them get along with and relate to others Support staff in 9 schools participating in the <i>Age Appropriate Pedagogies</i> approach.
